THE M10000 PROJECT

Last month I told you about the M10000 project that I am working on. One of my requirements as you

might recall was to upgrade the motor and add the TMCC control to the engine. This month I will talk about that upgrade.


In my treasure box of spare part I found an old 2023 that had been repainted so many times that the shell weighed more than the motor. Not seeing any use for this engine I decided that the motor would serve me well for the M10000 project. These motors are very smooth and trouble free.



The next step is to adapt it to the M10000. In order to do this I had to remove part of the lower frame from the engine base. I also had to make an adapter plate to mount the motor to the frame. Because the 2023 motor has Magna-traction, I elected to use brass for the mounting plate. Although I will talk about the smoke later, I also had to move the motor back so the smoke unit would have room. This required some removal of metal from the cab frame.



After fitting the motor to the frame, I next had to find room for the electronics that control the TMCC. If you look in the Lionel catalog you will find a page that offers controls to convert your old trains and upgrade them to TMCC. These are provide by Electric RR Co. I found them easy to work with and provide all the parts need for this conversion and any additional information that I needed. So I built a platform to mount the electronic controls. This will set on the side frame that is part of the engine cab.



With this I will be able to control the direction, sound, smoke, and interior lights. The interior light presented somewhat of a problem and I will talk about that later. In the photo you can see the speaker that was mounted on the control board. At the present time I am still waiting for the vestibules and bodies to come back from the powder coater and chrome shop. After I get them I can assemble everything and work out all the bugs.



The sliding shoe pick up for the power, to me, was just not going to work. So I used the roller pickup from the 2023. This required somewhat of a rework of the engine cab lower frame, but I think that it should work OK. I also had to mount the program / run switch on the frame along with the switch to turn off the smoke when not in use.

Next time I will talk about the interior light and smoke unit.


