#### PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Our Winter Cactus swap meet will be Saturday, February 17th, at the North Phoenix Baptist Church hall with set-up on Friday afternoon, the 16th, about 4pm. The church is at the southeast corner of Central and Bethany Home Roads for those unfamiliar with the location. Visit our website at www.gcmrr.org for more details.

For the second year in a row, this meet is a sellout. We need members to help before, during, and after the meet. We will start setting out road signs about 5:30 am that morning with seller access to the hall from 6-9am.

Sellers may use the NE door during that time, thus we'll need 2-3 people there for security. The public is allowed in via the main doors from 9am to 1pm. Clean up will start about 2pm.

Our goal for our meets is simple. We want both buyers and sellers to leave happy so they'll come back again. To that end, we need to get the word out to the public (potential buyers) so that they'll stop by. Think about how you can get the word out. #### **OLD BUSINESS:**

The state of the "S" gauge modules was discussed. Modules are functional but could use some new track and definitely some latches to hold the modules together. Re-construction of new "O" gauge modules was discussed. The questions of whether GCMR needs or even wants "O" modules was discussed. Dave Brown says let's get going on LCCA standard "O" gauge modules.

John Draftz reported that the status of our club's hunt for a new permanent location is still ongoing.

The GCMR Winter Cactus Meet is fast approaching. Currently, we have space for 149 tables. We may be able to squeeze two more in. We are very close to a complete sellout. The mobile trailer will definitely be there come rain or shine. We have 400 flyers to distribute. Volunteers to distribute will be sought at the membership meeting. There was discussion about having a pre-cactus gathering at a restaurant. Nothing was decided for this Winter Cactus Meet, but perhaps we may try something for the Summer Cactus Meet.

#### **NEW BUSINESS:**

We will be providing our mobile trailer at the Arizona Railway Museum on February 24th for Arizona Railway Day. The trailer will need to arrive before 7:00am. Show time is 9:00am until 4:00pm.

Our regular membership meeting on March 24th will have to move locations due to a church conflict. When and where we go will be discussed at the membership meeting.

### **January Meeting Minutes**

#### **ANNOUNCEMENTS:**

There will be no regular membership meeting next month in February due to the Winter Cactus Swap Meet.

Incoming new President John Draftz opened the meeting by acknowledging we had two guests present, Earl Woody, and Sam McElwee's wife Roxanna. Glenn Saber gave the treasurer's report noting the amounts available in our accounts. Bill Richardson gave the Secretary's report. Reports were accepted by the membership present. Motion was made to approve the Secretary's October minutes as printed in the November 2018 Mainline.

#### **OLD BUSINESS:**

Bill Lazenby reported to the membership the results of the GCMR BOD elections. Elected to their positions were President John Draftz, Vice President Jack Eaton, Treasurer Glenn Saber, Secretary Bill Richardson, and Board Members George Bean and Janet Mattern. Dave Brown will serve as Past President.

The GCMR Winter Cactus Meet will be Saturday February 17 from 9:00am until 1:00pm. Currently, we have sold 140 tables and we have space for about 150 tables. Setup will be Friday the day before.

The mobile trailer will arrive Friday at about 4pm. We need people to run trains on the mobile layout during the swap meet. We will also need people to secure the doors. Janet Mattern will once again sell raffle tickets with a little help from her friends. We have 400 flyers to distribute. Several members volunteered to distribute the flyers to the various hobby shops.

The state of the "S" gauge modules was reported. The modules are functional but could use some new track, some latches to hold the modules together, and some leg brackets.

The state of the mobile trailer layout was reported as needing some electrical work along with some work on the canvas.

John Draftz reported that a permanent location for our club at the state fair grounds was probably not going to occur.

President John Draftz would like to see more trains running at our membership meetings since we are an operating club. He also wants everyone to think about more things the GCMR could do as a club. Some examples might be a pot luck dinner or a Durango Silverton train ride. Any ideas are appreciated.

Janet Mattern will once again be the GCMR minimeet coordinator. The minimeet is scheduled for our April 28 meeting. Tables are limited so if you would like a table be sure to contact her.

#### **NEW BUSINESS:**

Our regular GCMR Membership Meeting on March 24 will have to move to a new date or a new location due to some church conflicts. After some discussion it was decided to keep the date the same but move our March 24th meeting to a new location. John Draftz will check with his church to verify that we can go there this one time. Be sure to check your March 2018 Main Line for the exact location of our March membership meeting.

Glenn Saber reported that Big Stitch is who we dealt with for our GCMR club shirts. They have our emblem, golf type shirts, hats, patches. An idea to






