Since the Lionel BluTooth starter sets started coming out a few years ago, I have found a new set almost every year that I could not resist. First up was the Charlie Brown Halloween set (https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=Kh0WWaTMtuU). Following that was the Batman set, the First Responders set and when the Blu Tooth version of the Polar Express came out, I upgraded mine with that one. They are great to take to our Prescott Mall layout to run for the public and when our group goes to local schools to run trains for the kids.

Last year's Lionel Vol 2 catalog didn't have anything I thought was interesting, so nothing was ordered. Then on the OGR chat line, a fellow did a photo review of the Budweiser Clyesdale train set. It looked really cool. In my other life, the Atonna's are horse and carriage people and the Budweiser Clyesdale hitch has always been a delight to follow. (We have a family room full of beer signs featuring them.)

I was so impressed with the review, I immediately ordered the set, plus the add-on Clyesdales box car. It arrived in time to be my principal Christmas present.

All of the previous sets have had one serious problem, although the sounds are nice, their volume is not loud. And when you are running them in a noisy environment, it is hard to hear the sounds - clever as they are. I even replaced the speaker in the Polar Express set with a higher end one - not enough improvement. Running the newer ones on my Lionel phone app where you can adjust the sounds





didn't help enough either. So, on Christmas, I opened the Clyesdale set and it was really nicely done - and colorful!. But what really delighted me were the sounds. Not only were there several times the number of "dialogs" as in previous sets, but you could HEAR them! So the set ran on our Christmas layout till it was taken down.

The set has run at our January and February mall runs and I still delight in playing the dialogs as the set starts and runs on its layout.

And another surprise, if you open the new 2019 Lionel catalog on their website, you will see that several of the BluTooth set pages have a "dialog" button on them. You can actually play the set's sounds from the catalog. And yes, the Clyesdale set has its sounds! Go to the catalog and see what I am talking about.

NOBODY PLAYS

Last month, I was interested to see if there were other GCMR members who collect Lionel paper. If you remember I wanted to compare the classic 1950 Lionel catalog with its later "Sorry" catalog to see how many differences you may find between the two. How many responses did I get - zero!


OK, enough of that. But in case you have these catalogs, here is what I found:

- 1) #1461S freight set: Sorry has the correct plastic truck side frames from the Scout series, regular catalog shows them with metal side frames. (This is the famous, or infamous, set with smoke but no bellows to make it puff. Loco #6110 has a hole in the boiler front and air "rushing" in was supposed to carry the smoke from the heater through the stack. Needless to say, it didn't work very well. But they priced the set \$5 less to keep it in the low price range.)
- 2) #1457B diesel switcher set. Catalog shows the loco with New York Central lettering, which was never made. Sorry shows it with the correct ATSF lettering.
- 3) #1464W, #1467W Alco diesel sets (including the famous orange Union Pacific colors sets). The catalog shows the locos rendered correctly as the locos were made. Sorry shows them as a strange graphic looking more like a GM E series diesel. So, they started showing it correctly and then changed to an incorrect graphic.
- 4) #2330 GG1. Neither catalog mentions that the GG1 now has two motors
- 5) Sorry catalog introduces the ATSF and NYC B units. No mention in the regular catalog.
- 6) #213 lift bridge, the one that was never made. Both catalogs show this. So, the decision not to run this accessory must have been made late in the production cycle.
- 7) Both catalogs show the #2035 steamer as #6035 on the locomotives page, even though the set listings show it correctly.

- 8) #4333 Electronic set is no longer in the Sorry catalog
- 9) #455 Sunoco oil well sign has two versions of the sign in each catalog, mentioning "Sunoco Dynaflow". As produced, no mention of that, instead, below the Sunoco logo is simply the name and item number.

Let me try one more catalog play this month. As all know, Lionel, as well as Flyer, always showed their lowest price sets first in the catalog, then moved to the more and most expensive sets. But I was curious to see exactly how they added features to the sets as their prices rose. So, I took the 1962 catalog, where that is pretty obvious, and the last catalog before Lionel's precipitous decent into mediocrity, to illustrate their pattern.

Here is a table of all the sets in that catalog with each set's component.



Under Engine: Steam* is the cheap Scout type motor; Diesel (2) means two units, power and dummy; Engine Features: L - light; S - smoke; W - whistle; H - horn; Op. Cars - operating cars; Play cars - cars with removable loads

Notes: Steam engines cost more to make than diesels, hence are higher priced forcing fewer cars in the same priced set. Same with passenger cars, they cost more than freight cars. A curious fact: the GG1 was priced \$5 higher than the 2383 Santa Fe F-3 diesel! Note the sweet spot in 027 sets: 5 of the 11 sets are priced at \$40 or \$50. Finally, there are only two O gauge and one O27 passenger sets. Freight sets always were considered to have more "play value" and sales must have born that out.



(A DMR is the modern version of a Budd car, in that it contains its own diesel power, but does not require a separate locomotive.
