
### **GRAND RAILWAY HOTELS:**



Last month I was called out of retirement to attend a business meeting in Indianapolis. Since I work for a nonprofit charity, I always try to save money whenever possible and was delighted to find out that it was cheaper to fly from Phoenix to Chicago and take Amtrak to Indianapolis, than to fly direct to Indianapolis and take a cab from the airport to the city. The \$5.00 Blue Line "L" connection from O'Hare Terminal 2 to Chicago Union Station was fast, efficient, and didn't significantly add to the bottom line.

Arriving in Indianapolis, however, was a nasty shock. The Indy Amtrak station is dark, dank, and forbidding, tucked under the train shed. It's only saving grace is that it is centrally located and easy walking distance to major downtown attractions and hotels. I checked into the hotel that I was assigned, which was pleasant enough, only to discover the next day that I

could have stayed at an entirely different hotel, closer to the station and a world apart – the Crowne Plaza Downtown Indianapolis!






The Crowne Plaza's 273 modern rooms are housed in the converted train shed, which has a turn-of-the-century factory feel. The real attraction is the Romanesque head-house, dating back to 1888.



The interior of the head-house has been lovingly preserved in all its glory, with stained glass, glazed tiles, 60-foot vaulted ceiling, and exposed iron beams.






The really unique feature of the Crowne Plaza, and what sets it apart from the other grand railroad hotels, is the collection of 13 Pullman

cars, on their tracks, which have been converted into two hotel rooms each. The interiors of the rooms are modern – the original Pullman bunks and plumbing probably wouldn't get occupancy permits in the 21st century – but you can still experience the thrill of climbing the stairs to board the car and squeezing down the train car's corridor. The rooms are tiny and narrow, but your nighttime dreams will be large.




