Thus, when Lionel came out with their version of the train, it immediately found a home here.

THE LAYOUT CONTINUES

Since the May issue much has been done on the layout. I played with the trains for a while and decided I didn't like the S curve going into the station area. I moved the outer line inward to straighten it. I didn't have to move the inner loops.





Not shown in the photos, but IMPORTANT to the appearance of the layout. One day I was looking on eBay for the Lionel 38 locos I collect, and I saw a listing for 38" long Lionel Track. It was a K-line carton with 16 sections of extra tie straights that match the 072 curves. I bought the box for the amazing price of \$56 postpaid. Now I have enough of the extra tie track to do the layout except the area in the passenger station. You won't see the track there anyway because of the platforms.

With the track where I wanted it, I marked it so I know where the roadbed goes. I tried using a sheet of cardboard held along the edge of the ties, but that was unwieldy. So I mounted a block of scrap wood on tender frame with trucks from my junk box and used cable ties to attach a marker. Rolling it along the track made a good line.





Then I added the track for the Hornby engine shed. I won't use this, but I like the building.



I found another box of Schoenhut buildings. I know there is still another box somewhere because I have a barn that is not out yet. So now I have both gas stations, the church, and the station on the layout. The station is in the picture on the left edge with the roof off. I'll repurpose the station as a school when I clean it up.

The Schoenhut buildings were wood kits and didn't come with lights. I cut the bottoms out with the router so bulbs can be mounted on the layout. Because the Schoenhut town area cannot be reached from under the layout, I cut grooves in the homasote with a circular saw so I could wire the lights.

At that point, I marked the roads and took everything off the layout except the houses and streetlights on the mountain. Then I wired them up using Scotchlock connectors.







Now for the styrofoam mountain. . . Last year, I got a bunch of the blue foam for free, and would have taken more if I'd known how much it cost. I did buy some small sheets of white foam. I blocked out the mountain using foam, and then started carving. I have hot wire tools, but found a drywall saw and a wire brush worked really quick.







With the mountain shaped but for the two ends where the glue failed, I put plaster cloth where the foam meets the wood. Hopefully this will prevent cracking, and will certainly help keep plaster off the carpet underneath.







That's where I'm at now. I'm going to do three different colored coats of plaster. The first coat will be black, second coat will be gray, and the third coat will be a tan color. I have different plasters so the outer coats will be softer. Then I'll wire brush the plaster to get texture and color.



If this works, we'll call it the Gibbs method. If it doesn't work, I'll paint over it, and we'll never mention it again.
