June Board Meeting

The fall Railfair is set to go for Oct 2 & 3rd with layout emplacements on Friday Oct 1, about 4pm.

The ARM in Chandler will have a fall open house on November 13. We take the mobile layout to it. There is a Tucson swap meet that day.

Schnepf Farms in Queen Creek may still be a venue but nothing is known at this time.

The mobile layout will need maintenance before use. Saturday, September 18, at Adobe Mountain, will be the date. John Draftz will check with the MLS to see if we can again use their patio. The wiring and sliding drawers need attention. Some snaps are "broken".

John Draftz has the secretary's history files. The BoD gave him the OK to purge the files as appropriate.

A cover for the mobile layout and probably the module trailer is needed. The option of a Ramada type cover (AKA pole barn) with some sides to keep direct sun and rain off may work. Glenn Saber has researched places like Lowe's and Home Depot to determine what's available for a 20x20 cover for the trailers at Adobe. He will send the BoD members options. The estimated cost is \$2000-3000. An option to be considered is creating a hard surface, e.g.,

asphalt, to park the trailers on. John D has made contact with Sahuaro Central who asked him to have the GCMR present a proposal with details to them at its meeting July 10.

It was noted that Glenn Saber is the meet chairperson and John Draftz is the registration coordinator.

Glenn Saber gave a brief report on the Summer Cactus. We are about 65% sold out at this point with more coming in. We have tickets for four railroads plus other raffle prizes at this point. Glenn Saber sent out broadcast e-mails to past attendees alerting them to the fact that the Summer Cactus meet will happen.

It was noted that Peter will probably NOT be at the meet thus another auctioneer will be needed.

SCENIC RAILWAYS IN THE U.S. Lin Sinclair

Did you ever hear of the Boone Railroad Historical Society??? (Boone, Iowa, according to Wikipedia, in 2010 had approximately 26,000 people.)

Somehow in 1983 this town managed to get together \$50,000.00 to buy 11.3 mile of track, land, bridges--and probably some leftover rolling stock--from the soon-to-be-abandoned railway holdings of Fort Dodge, Des Moines & Southern, Chicago & North Western Railway which evidently got its start [likely with a lot fewer place names in its title] in 1893.

The price of playing with really big trains picked up considerably along the way, because in 1989 the "Iowa Railroad Historical Society" (of which the Boone Railroad Historical Society is a division) purchased the world's last commercially produced steam locomotive (constructed in Datong, China), JS8419, for \$350,000!

And...somehow these historical societies also managed to put together the money to buy a GMD FP9A diesel locomotive, with complimentary rolling stock, to feature high-end dining car events as well as lunch events (the regular passenger cars being for routine ridealong excursions).

All of the related cars/loco are painted the nicest, friendliest hot-dog mustard color. (But not Grey Poupon mustard color...) This group has also added dessert and picnic trains, plus special event trains such as Thomas The Tank Engine™, the Easter Bunny Express, the Pumpkin Express, and the Santa Express™, as well as Weekend Getaways and Barbeque Dinners! What's not to like???

This group has a restored "motorcar" which is actually a teeny-tiny solo operating car that gives passengers a chance to see what it was like to inspect the rails way back when. And, yes, it really does run across a VERY high trestle bridge on demo rides! (3D commercially available trucks equipped with x-ray, sonar and the like are now used as rolling stock across the U.S. to inspect train tracks--sigh...)

Some of this railway's electrified service got messed up along the way by a flood, so diesel engines took over handling their freight business. No matter! This industrious group decided to just "shake it off" and handily put together a working electric trolley line that goes from the line's "depot" to downtown Boone. Just like that!

One of their trollies (CCW Car Number 50) was built by the McGuire-Cummings Company of Paris, Illinois in 1915 and is an example of a combo passenger/luggage/mail car that was an "interurban" car servicing densely populated towns/cities. (This is a deliciously restored car!) Other trolley cars in their collection are former Chicago, South Shore & South Bend cars built in 1927. On a more modern note, Boone's trolley collection even includes Metra Bi-Level Cars "Highliner" cars!

Their 2-8-2 steam locomotive (#8419) is currently down for inspection/repairs. When they take this loco out for a run, they report it consumes about 1,500 gallons of water and something less than one (1) T-O-N of coal.

The Iowa Railroad Historical Society has bought supporting equipment along the way for this railway, as well as rolling stock and buildings for this bustling train metropolis, which they restore as funding becomes available. Unbelievably, all of the work on their tracks, grounds, buildings, locomotives and cars is done by volunteers. They even have had folks move to Boone from other countries just to be able to work with this small-town/mega-thinking train project. Their website now refers to this train conglomerate as the "Boone & Scenic Valley Railroad." All in all, this is the little town that could... With its very own life-sized, realistic theme park train!

Would I ever think of moving to Boone, Iowa to help work on this line? Having once turned down a job offer in Bloomington, Illinois (not that far from South Dakota winters, ya know?), I don't think so. And I actually once visited Davenport, Iowa--on PURPOSE. ... (What was I thinking?!!?) Now I'm just trying to figure out how I can justify a visit to Boone, Iowa to see/ ride on all their neat real-life trains! :-)
