TERRY'S BASEMENT TRAIN EMPIRE UPATE

My goal is to have all my trains unpacked and either on layouts or shelves by the time I am 60 years old. I have almost a year left and am on track.

The Marklin layout I wrote about last time has been moving along in fits and starts as I source bits of catenary for it. It does run and it's mostly landscaped, but the catenary presents a problem. . . Once the wires go up on the front of

the layout, you can't work on the back without breaking poles.

So while waiting for the bits of Marklin wire, I started on the American Flyer S Gauge layout. This goes in the eastern end of the basement and is 10 by 6.3 feet. It's on the floor like the O gauge layout, and an 00 layout will go over it. You can walk all the way around the layout.

About ten years ago I bought a whole bunch of really nice American Flyer trains. In the deal were a 346 0-8-0 switcher and the 326 Hudson with three red heavyweight cars. I always liked the way the little 0-8-0 locos looked, so kept those sets. Since then I've added more. I only have S trains made between 1953 and 1958, and accessories that look good with them.

I started with some track on the floor so I could position the legs for the 00 layout. Then I built some of the deck and checked the legs.

I decided to paint the whole layout with a texture like a deck or a tennis court. Walmart sells little bottles of paint cheap, so I had a gallon of paint made to match their dark green and added aggregate. I'll use the Walmart paint to make roads and a little lake by the bridges.

Right now I have the accessories on the layout so I can see where the roads and rivers go. I'll run the trains for a while and then set everything aside and paint more. There are no holes in the board because I don't want paint on the carpet underneath. I'll wire everything later.

I had the NP set cruising around the track as I put out the accessories and it ran without a problem for two hours. Then I put an accessory with wires too close to the track and caused a crash!

Here's pictures of the progress. The last ones show the 326 Hudson and the 0-8-0 sets on the layout. All the pictures with the green base were taken on Sunday 7-10 as I unpacked the accessories and set them out.


