NEW BUSINESS:

Prizes for the July Summer Cactus meet include: a CTT subscription, two tickets on the Grand Canyon, a boxed (used) Lionel freight set, the Magma Arizona set plus extra ore car, and a musical trains Christmas tree. John will contact other donors in June.

The format of the post-meet auction was discussed noting that a seller may need to be limited to not more than a certain number of consecutive lots, e.g., 5. No decision was made at this time.

The June 24th meeting will be the annual Hot Dog & Apple Pie meeting. Dave will bring the grill/propane, hot dogs & buns. Glenn will bring the apple pies. Janet will bring chips. John will bring ice cream. Bill Richardson is to bring the beverages.

The status of the modules was discussed. The S-gauge are in overall OK shape but will need some maintenance. The O-gauge need to have a better support system that will allow for ease in assembly and leveling. The configuration of the track on the modules was discussed. Options were: 2 O & 1 S, 2 O & 1 std/#1, and all O. Also discussed were: how to scenic them, switches for operations with industries versus a simple oval for just running, and having a single source construct the modules probably at a cost. No decision was made.

GCMR May 20 General Membership Meeting Minutes:

ANNOUNCEMENTS:

Treasurer Glenn Saber gave the Treasurer's report.

The report specified the amounts in the checking account and the PayPal account. Glenn reported GCMR made \$56 on the mini-meet. The report was accepted by the membership present.

Motion was made to approve Secretary's minutes as printed in the Mainline. The motion passed.

Reminder that the June 24th meeting will be the annual Hot Dog & Apple Pie meeting.

Reminder that the July 22nd Cactus Summer Meet in just around the corner.

The Beat-the-Heat bus trip and tour will be August 12th 2017. We will have the bus again: \$30 GCMR members, \$35 others. Bag lunch is extra.

OLD BUSINESS:

The number of "Beat the Heat" Bus riders is often less than the break-even number. The bus is open to non-GCMR members. Getting just a few more riders can be the break-even point. Glenn will send a notice to the other train clubs in the Valley.

John indicated the Summer Cactus is over 40% sold out. It was noted that the NPBC location with them renting tables, chairs and the PA system makes holding the meet much easier.

The S-gauge modules are in overall good shape but need maintenance. No further action on them was planned. The O-gauge modules will need significant attention. The committee members have presented different concerns as to how best to proceed. Bill Lazenby noted that the LCCA modules were easy to set up. Members were encouraged to review them on the LCCA web site. The first step is to identify what the table (the support system) would be. The good news is that almost all of our projected venues can be met with the mobile layout. The only two possible venues for the modules are October RailFair and the PVUMC at Christmas. In both situations, the S-gauge modules could suffice.

NEW BUSINESS:

The more potential buyers at a meet/mini-meet, the more successful the meet will probably be.

The question of how to increase attendance thru advertising was discussed. It was noted the World's Greatest show had exceptional turnout on Super Bowl Sunday. It was also noted that they had significant TV ads. No decision was made at this time.

SHOW AND TELL:

The theme was military trains:

- + Glenn Saber displayed a Kalamazoo G-gauge Civil War train.
- + Janet Mattern displayed a 9/11 first responders car.
- + John Draftz displayed an Ameritrains flat car with airplane and AHM HO Army cars.

NOW YOU SEE IT, NOW YOU DON'T?

When designing my original layout there was an area in back of the town of Rock Creek, along the far wall, where I felt I could not get access if needed without an access hatch. There was an area between the boards containing the track I left open in case I needed to pop up there if a problem occurred.

After the track was laid and all was operational, scenery progressed toward that location. Looking at my pop up location I said, this is not good. You can see the benchwork, the far wall and if you are tall enough, even the carpeting on the floor. So, I extended the scenery into the popup area and created a little valley with a lift out section of scenery in case I needed to get into that area.

The scene was delightful, a small lake, trees and a family of deer at the pond's edge.

That scene was there for a dozen years until the layout rebuilding started in 2014. And during that time did anybody notice my delightful scene with the pond and the deer? Nobody!

When the layout rebuilding began in 2014, I had to make major changes in that area, so all the original scenery at that corner and the lift-out was removed. The new design has a double track main line running along the scenic backdrop at the upper level, the same level as the bridge you see in the foreground.

Now, the question was whether to create another lift out that nobody will see, or perhaps to just extend the scenery down far enough that you will not notice that there is no "bottom" to it.

And that is what I did. With rock castings and scenery "skirting" made from scenic materials attached to stretched out fibre material, the sides of the opening extend down to the top of the main benchwork. I then painted the visible benchwork black.



Here is the view from the 'east' side of Rock Springs toward the new double track main line along the backdrop.

At my height, this works pretty well, from one side, if I look closely, I can see the painted benchwork, but not the floor/carpeting. But, what if you are tall - which I am not?

Then if you want to look closely, you will see the wall and opening below the benchmark. Now the question is how many folks will? No me!



Here is my view from the "west" side, as if I were looking from the balcony of Yolanda's.



And if you are really tall or flying over, here is what you would see.

The final question is, "if you have already been here, can you tell me where the deer are now?"
