PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Our June meeting will be the 23rd (It's the normal 4th Saturday but caution – June has five Saturdays). The BoD will meet at 8am with the regular meeting starting at 10 with trains running in between. The theme is Hot Dogs and Apple Pie; Flag Day; Red, White, and Blue trains; patriotic trains, cars, etc.; item(s) w/flag(s). What do you have for Show-n-Tell to go with that theme? It doesn't have to be rare or exotic. If you have trains to run, please bring them. Remember, there's no gauge restriction so bring whatever appeals to you.

On Saturday, June 16th, starting about 7am at Glenn Saber's house (3415 E Pasadena, just above Camelback), we'll have a mobile layout work party to get it ready for the start of our display season. Over time "stuff" has accumulated in the storage drawers so we need to organize them. We also need to work on the push button accessories the public has access to as well as other things. It shouldn't take more than 2-3 hours. Come help if you can.

Our Summer Cactus Meet will be held Saturday, July 28th, at the North Phoenix Baptist center (Bethany Home & Central). We'll do the initial hall setup the day before (Friday) starting about 4pm. We're going to try to hold a no-host pre-meet gathering Friday evening at Denny's or another restaurant starting about 6pm for members and guests who would like to simply get

together before the meet. More details as they evolve.

We already have over 90 tables of the estimated 150 tables "sold" for the meet. See our www.gcmrr.org site for details and the table reservation form. We'll need help with security, ticket sales, and at the door. Contact Jack Eaton (623-249-7297 or jeaton@cox.net) who is coordinating the assignments and let him know how you can help, even if it's only for part of the day.

It is right off SR69 in the heart of town. If you have been to the PV Event Center, the school is right to the east of it. There will be signs on RT 69 directing you right to the school.

Since you know this is the largest train swap meet in Northern Arizona it gives you a perfect excuse to plan a long weekend taking all the other activities in our area. As I see it, you have three choices for that weekend. First, you can get up early, drive up and go to the meet, then drive all the way home.

Second, you can drive up on Friday, stay in an area motel for Friday and Saturday nights - have a great dinner Friday at a local restaurant, go to the meet and open houses on Saturday. Even though the meet itself is in Prescott Valley, you still have a tremendous variety of activities if you would like to spend a weekend in the Prescott areas. Here are some of the weekend's activities around the Prescott area.

<u>Shopping</u> - Downtown Prescott has one of the finest antique and arts districts in the state. The district lines Cortez and Marina Streets.

<u>Museums</u> - Next to the old Activity Center is the Smoki Museum of Indian art, while downtown is Sharlott Hall Museum of local and Arizona history and just north of town is the Phippen Art Museum, one of the finest Western Art museums in the country.

Train Rides - Both the Grand Canyon Railway and the Verde Canyon Railroad are less than two hours from Prescott for a great Sunday day trip activity.

Outdoor activities - The Prescott area is a jumping off point for camping and fishing in the Bradshaw Mountains, bike riding on many of the area trails and hiking in Thumb Butte, Granite Mountain or the Peavine Rails to Trails. Lynx and Watson Lakes are great picnic locations.




