### **MEETING NOTES**

Board Meeting: Members present: Doyle Bain, Dave Brown, John Kendig, Janet Mattern, Gordon Wilson, John Zaval

John Draftz gave a brief report on Summer Cactus. We have about 40% sold out at this point with more coming in. We have tickets for Grand Canyon Railway and two HO cars from Walthers. More prizes yet to come. Question was raised about getting sports raffle prizes, e.g., a football. It was decided not to since previous attempts weren't that great.

The August Beat the Heat bus trip has reservations coming in. It was noted that the TCA convention was in the LA area at the same time. It was felt the conflict would not be a significant problem.

It was decided that drawings for white tickets at meetings are on a must-be-present-to-win basis. The October drawing allows for absent winners.

The fall Railfair may not be held. The park may have other activities near it. The event may be moved to spring. Our mobile layout presence is thus on hold.

When to have a pizza meeting will be decided in June – October is probable.

Doyle Bain will call absent members to update them on meeting restriction changes and remind them of the June meeting.

John Zaval reported that the mobile layout is critter free but that it will need maintenance before use. September may be the month. The sliding drawers need attention. Some snaps are "broken".

A cover for the mobile layout and possibly the module trailer is needed. An intermodal container has too narrow an opening and a storage locker big enough for the mobile layout and other club "stuff" may be too expensive. Other options were discussed such as a Ramada type cover with some sides to keep direct sun and rain off may work. A decision may be made in June.

The ARM in Chandler may have a fall open house. We take the mobile layout to it. Nothing is definite at this time.

Schnepf Farms in Queen Creek may still be a venue but nothing is known at this time.

Gordon Wilson offered to review a proof copy of the newsletter for any grammar/punctuation errors.


#### HOLLYWOOD TRAINSPOTTING

People come over and ask me "What's your favorite train?




I could point at this 1909 Lionel steam loco and claim it was may favorite, but that would leave out these little locos from the late teens and early 1920s:



There are a lot of them so they must be special to me. I bought the first one in 1972 from the neighbor. I was nine-years-old. I spent the decades since searching out the different



variations, but now they just sit there. And what about these 33 locos? They fascinate me. I have over two dozen of them, and I keep finding new variations. When guests ask about these locos I can see their eyes glass over as I start pointing the differences. Come to think of it, these are usually the last trains I show people when they come over. As a group, they are neat, but individually they are boring.



This fancy black loco with it's walnut display board must be special because it has a place of honor over the door. Nope. That's more of a train my dad liked so I keep it.



Finally the bus trip to Prescott is ON! Ride the bus for an all in one package day: go to the swap meet, have lunch and visit some of the open houses.




