#### WILLIAMS BNSF DERAILMENT

We all read about sometimes there are spectacular derailments on "real" railroads - that is in contrast to those on our layouts. It is not often that one happens in our backyard. But earlier this month a very long, westbound BNSF train carrying autoracks derailed just east of Williams Junction.

From early reports, one of the mid train diesel units caused a ripple effect in the train causing one or more of the cars to jump the tracks. The rest of the train then piled into it and ended up with a massive derailment of what looked like the rear half of the train.

From the reports I've read, the cars were carrying all Ford vehicles: EV's, pickup trucks,


