#### Old Business

+ Swap meet:

Setup for the "O" and "S" gauge modules will be on Friday March 4th from 4:00 to 6:00 PM. Bill Richardson will bring/return the module trailer. The Church staff will setup the tables and chairs and provide the PA system.

This year's Cactus Winter Meet is at North Phoenix Baptist Church on Saturday March 5th from 9:00 AM - 1:00 PM. Doors open for vendors at 6:00 AM. Some Donuts and Coffee will be provided for vendors, but no other food or drink will be provided. Table sales are currently at 125 tables sold. We will have additional directional signs this year. John Draftz and Jack Eaton will setup and take down the signs on Saturday. Tony Ford will be in charge of the loading/unloading Door security on Saturday. Janet Mattern, Rod Johnson, and Glenn Saber will start presale tickets at 8:30 AM. Janet Mattern and Bill Richardson will sell Raffle tickets.

+ Due to some perceived problems by the folks at Falcon Field about us getting our "O" and "S" gauge modules into the building early enough on Saturday, March 26th to avoid congestion, we will NOT be participating in the Falcon Field Airport Open House this year. <u>New Business:</u>

+ There will be some work parties scheduled for the trailers and the modules coming up soon.

+ We need to get more members running trains.

+ The first Saturday in April, the second, is the three club picnic (TCADD, GCMR, P&P) at the Stillman Ramada (by the tunnel) in the McCormick-Stillman Railroad Park. This picnic in reality is now probably a six club picnic. Burgers, hot dogs, and chicken will be provided. Soda and water will also be provided. You may bring a dessert or side dish to share if you want. The picnic will run from about 10:00 AM - 1:00 PM give or take a little. After the picnic Herb Andreen will host an open house for those who wish to see his large "O" gauge layout. ## SWAP MEET SUMMARY

Our net profit is \$3,020.09. This was not bad, but it also was not our best. Profit would have been \$342.09 higher without deductions for the six new Train Swap Meet signs which will be used over and over. We also bought a box of Avery name tag labels that will spread out over a few more swap meets.

General Admission was 365 people. This was less than last summer's Cactus Swap Meet which had 380. This number is also nowhere near the Armory's 600 average. Admission is pure profit as table rentals cover the costs of the event. At the Armory, I had a solid line of people at the door for almost 1.5 hours. At this winter's Cactus, the solid line was done in 45 minutes. What's wrong? Where are the people? How do we get more people?

We sold 136 sales tables - the most ever. Trishia Richardson (Bill's wife) helped almost the entire day at the ticketing table with me. Janet Mattern and Bill Richardson did a great job selling Fantastic Raffle tickets. For only seven prizes, they sold 480 tickets way above typical. John Draftz did all the table sales, vendor sign-in, much of the public address announcing, coffee and donut prep. Table set up and tear down is the responsibility of the Church and they did a marvelous job following our layout plan exactly.

Finally, I found out that Terry Gibb's <u>azmodeltrains.com</u> web site is a MAJOR player - and help. More coupons were printed from that web site than our own - 54 verses 44. In the final weeks

prior to the show, his Cactus link failed and we received many complaints from people not being able to print our coupon - all from azmodeltrains.com - not from gcmrr.com!

### WHAT'S UP DOCK?

What do you do when a building on your layout has a door but no loading dock? Well, you could just drive up to the door or you could scratch build a loading dock.



The loading dock that I was going to build was going to be a 10 foot by 32 foot in "O" scale feet. So a quick run to the local hobby shop to buy some scale styrene plastic. This being a simple build, I only needed two sizes of material. The first was .250" x .250" stock. These will be the 1 foot by 1 foot main frame. The other material was .020" x .250" stock for the deck of the loading



dock. This is 1 inch by 1 foot stock in "O" scale.

The first step is to cut the .250" X .250". I used my band saw, but a Zonna saw will just as well. I cut 2 each 8 inch sticks, 2 each 2 inch sticks, and 13 each .250 inch legs for the dock to stand on.

So, it's time to assemble the main frame of the loading dock. The 8 inch pieces sit on the out side of the 2 inch pieces; this will give you the 32 by 10 foot dock as the plan called for. But remember the diagonals from one corner the opposite corner must be the same for the dock to be square.



Next, it's time for the legs. In the front, there will be 9 legs, one on each side and two across the back. You only need two across the back because this side will face the building and no one will see this side. On the front, the legs will 23/32 of an inch apart, that 1/32 short of <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> of an inch. Face the cut edge toward the outside of the dock so that the good <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> inch is good for measuring between legs, and the height is also the good <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> inch. This will make sure that the loading dock sits level.






The next step is to cut the stock for the deck. This is where the .020" X .250" material is going to be used. This stuff is thin enough to cut with a pair of scissors. Make each plank 2 ½ inches long. Cut 31 planks. Next glue the planks in place. Note that I put just a little space between each plank. If you place the planks without this space, it will look like just one solid top. I prefer seeing the individual planks, but it's your call.



You will also note in the next picture, that I put a single thin plank on edge half ways between the two long main frame pieces. This is to just make it a little stronger in the middle.



With the deck done, now it's time to paint. I also use "aging solution" to make it look like it's been in use. Next time I will show the finishing of the loading area.
