The In-the-Heat swap meet was this past summer. Unfortunately, they chose to hold another meet scheduled for the same day (again) as our November monthly meeting. At the last meeting, as a courtesy to our members, we decided to delay the November meeting start time by one hour starting at 11 rather than 10am. This will give our members time to attend that meet if they wish and then attend our meeting. We'll still plan to have the hall open about 8:30 with donuts available thus giving members and guests a little extra time to visit and run trains. The goal is to still end the meeting by noon.

Over the past year plus, we've brought either the Ogauge or S-gauge modules or the kid's layout to the meeting to have trains running. And while this provides members an opportunity to run trains, it also creates an undesired problem. In short, someone has to pick up the module trailer and transport it to the meeting where whatever is to be used is set up. At the end of the meeting, the process is reversed. We actually end up spending more time in set up and tear down than we do in running trains.

I'm proposing we return to our days of "yesteryear" when we simply assembled sectional track into whatever shape we wanted, ran our trains, and then disassembled the track until the next time we wanted to "play" with our trains. In simple terms, I'm suggesting each member so motivated bring a simple oval of track and a train to run on the track along with a transformer. We have a lot of floor space for those who want the floor. We have numerous tables available that can be pushed together as needed for those who want to run on tables.

This process will allow us to have more than just two trains running and allow for multiple gauges at any given meeting. If this concept makes sense to you, please bring track, train and power source to the meeting. Let's see how many trains we can get running at a meeting.


