RAILFAIR 2010

October 9 and 10 was a great couple of days for model railroading. The days were warm, but not real hot and the crowds were just about right. More than 9,000 people visited the McCormick Stillman Railroad Park over the two days and the GCMR Trailer and modules were in a prime location to attract visitors, and come they did!

The Park had been in a real rush over the previous couple of weeks to get things ready for our guests. The parking lot was being repaved. The paving company, delayed by the rain, went the extra mile to open an as yet unfinished section and put in temporary paving to open the east entrance. Things seemed a little crowded but the lot actually contained 30 more parking spaces than last year. When it's finished it will be 60 more than last year.

Many of the grass areas had newly laid sod and the weekend gave it a real workout. Some displays had their size reduced due to soggy ground, but the GCMR area was in pretty good shape.

Getting members to man the trailer and modules is getting to be a concern since the TCA and P&P clubs share their most active members, so it was a long day without much of a break for folks manning the modules and trailer.

In addition to the outdoor layouts, P&P had to man their module setup, clubroom, and the new building's O gauge layout. As with the GCMR, members of the TCA and P&P put in long hours in each of these venues. Fortunately members of all clubs moved about, pitching in so others could visit throughout the Park.

The crown jewel of the 2010 Rail Fair was the unveiling of the new Model Railroad Building. The 10,000 square foot building will house three equal size layout areas featuring O, N, and HO gauges. For the "soft" opening, the O gauge club had one loop of track running. The N gauge group had set up some of their portable modules and the HO displayed rolling stock and fielded questions about the technique they are using to build their layout benchwork.

EagleWings Iron Craft supplied both a G and O gauge overhead system for the lobby area. Two G gauge trains circled the entire lobby while three O gauge trains looped back and forth using the now familiar "magic of three rail" technique that you have seen at the GCMR Mid Winter Meets. It is just on a larger loop with 30+ foot straights. Wonderful!

The new P&P layout had one track running three trains most of the two days. It was amazing to see a layout that two weeks before did not exist, now in the building and running trains all day long. The P&P guys tried to find out how fast a train the new track would tolerate, so they stripped it down to one seven car passenger train headed by an ABA diesel. Speed started out at 60 scale miles per hour and it seemed a leisurely pace around such a large loop (160+ feet) and it took 1 minute 15 seconds to run the loop. The

top speed was 120 scale MPH and did the loop in 31 seconds! Now we don't plan to run at that speed but the consist seemed rock solid on every turn for the 25 or 30 loops we ran. The only reason we didn't go faster was the DCS controller topped out at 120! Why do such a stupid thing? Because the Atlas 21 Century track and our track laying techniques were new to us and we really needed to find out if it was as good as it seemed. It is!

The new building is not open yet, hence the "soft" opening. The builder is completing the details and the building will be tested to see if it meets "Green" building standards. The real opening is yet to be announced, but the clubs should be able to continue construction of their layouts by mid-November. Of course, once the P&P has access you will probably be allowed to visit as layout construction progresses.
