Board Meeting

The S gauge modules need maintenance. The cost depends on the type of maintenance needed. A work party was not scheduled at this time.

New O gauge modules were discussed. John said the fairgrounds person said she would like the meet in November after the fair to discuss that site as possible permanent location for the GCMR. The module topic will be postponed until the January '18 meeting.

The Rails, Rods and Steel Wheels show at Mesa's Pioneer Park is probably cancelled due to park maintenance.

John reported that we have almost 30 tables sold of the 150 available for the Winter Cactus meet in February.

It was noted that the mini-meets are popular but only net a small amount of income. The topic of meet/mini meet advertising was discussed. We need to find ways to get more public to attend without having over crowding issues. No way was identified. This needs to go to the members.

We will continue to have the Annual 1K Raffle. The prizes will be: 1st - \$600, 2nd - \$300, 3rd - \$100. We need to find ways not to loose money. This will be discussed at the January meeting.


Advertising - The topic of meet/mini meet advertising was discussed. We need to find ways to get more public to attend without having over-crowding issues. Need to get our member's ideas.




