A MYSTERY FROM BOB DENNISON

I have recently restored an American Flyer President's Special locomotive for a friend. But it is a strange one and I was wondering if any members might have information on it they could share.

Here are the specifics: 1. The main frame is typical of all Flyer 4-4-4 electrics

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2. The pilot trucks differ in that the wheel spacer is bolted to the frame for the pilot trucks. The frames themselves have the punching for the side ladders that is typical of the #4689 President's Special loco. The front wheel spacer has a hand cut slot to clear the swaging on for the eagle's post.

3. The motor is typical except it has the earlier reverse unit with the directional lighting feature. The motor does have the bell ringing mechanism.

4. The body is apparently that of a repunched #4687 (1927) loco as follows:

+ Side and front windows have had the webbing removed and repunched to accept brass window frames.

+ Front and rear doors have been repunched to accept brass door inserts

+ All four corners have punching for adding 1" handrails

+ The front and rear corners have the three hole punch for the earlier rod handrails.

+ The ventilators on each side are painted instead of brass

+ There are only two plates per side, one American Flyer and one #4689. There is no "Commander" plate or punching to mount one.

+ The roof has the punching for the #4689 plus the punching for the ringing bell.

I have no idea whether this is a prototype or something made up at the factory to use up parts. I know when I got it, what was left of the color was the early side blue. The condition was poor. It looked like it had been in a dishwasher at one time and had pitted rust at the top seam on one side.

If anyone can shed some light on this item, I would appreciate it.
