Bill was more of an operator than a collector, and he operated American Flyer. Desert Division's modules ran Standard Gauge and O gauge exclusively however the modules from the 90's were in poor shape. After much indecision we transitioned to 4'x8' tables that we custom laid track at every show. Gone was the Standard Gauge loop and yellow Thomas the Tank G gauge track appeared to take its place. Many of us were two decades younger and the Division had a very active Kid's Club. I was the Division Module Chairman at the time and Bill stopped by our module one afternoon at Rail Fair



After the auction was over he came up to me and in a good-natured way asked why I was bidding against him on some of the American Flyer items. I replied that after I watched his train run at Rail Fair I decided to buy a few American Flyer items to run on the module in the future. That smile on Bill's got a little brighter and before he turned and walked away said, "Yup, good reason."



BILL EAST REMEMBERED

This has been a hard summer for me, my good friend, Bill East passed away after nine month or so long decline. During this decline I started to try to remember when Bill became part of my life. Looking at the TCA roster, I found that Bill joined TCA in 2001, when I looked for old TTOS rosters, I found no mention of him in 1996. So I figured that around 2000 he joined our groups.

You must remember back at that time, both clubs were much larger, and when new people joined, you might not notice them because they were with other people, and Bill ran those funny "S" gauge trains that was missing a rail. About this time was also the time I was getting to know my future wife's family and planning a wedding.

The first train trade I made with Bill came a some swap meet when I had bought several "S" gauge junker tank cars with frames but no trucks. Bill knew that I ran "O" gauge trains, and wondered why I had bought those cars. I explained to him that I was scratch building some flat cars to make into tank cars which is what the Pacific Coast did when oil was discovered in the area. Bill then told me if all I needed was the tanks, he had several junkers that would work and would trade for the ones I had. That was OK with me so I gave him the tank cars that I had, and at the next meeting I got "S" gauge tanks for my trains. From there the friendship

started. If I won an "S" gauge car, it would be Bill's, and visa versa with "O" gauge cars. One time he won an "O" gauge car with auto on it, he took the auto and gave me the flat car.

When Bill became President of the club, we would have the board meeting at his home on the north side of South Mountain. I would get his President's message in writing, then I would type it up on the computer and sent it on to Peter.

All of a sudden we stopped seeing Bill at the meeting. I found out later that he had given up driving due to age. About the same time I move from Scottsdale to south Phoenix, just a few miles from his home. So I started to take him to all the train club meeting. We also teamed up on run days at Paradise and Pacific. When I started doing this, I found that Bill and I had another like in common, Long John Silvers. Back then the one at Southern and Rural was our hangout.

After it closed, it was 19th Ave and Bell (we tried the combo LJS and Taco Bell combo but it didn't work out) Yes it was a long way from TCA meeting up to LJS on Bell but what the heck, it was fun, and after a cold night running out at Adobe Mountain for their Christmas Lights, a bowl of broccoli cheese soup sure hit the spot.

Bill was always ready to run trains, and we went to many different places to do so. We went to Williams for a Grand Canyon run. I cornered all the other people running and asked them to help me watch Bill at this high altitude. I planned to watch him like a hawk, and just wanted the added help of the others. The big thing for Bill on this run was the ride on the creeper, a short train ride out a few miles and then back. But it was powered by a steam engine, the best thing of all. Bill was all smiles for the whole ride. The LA area for the Cal Stewart meet where he found a car he has been looking for to add to his tank cars, a Hooker chemical tank car. Of course we teased him about going to LA to buy a hooker. He would just smile. I had lots of fun picking on him.

We would go to a swap meet and I would tell him not to pass up on any New York Central Diesels! TO which he would just say NOOOOOO!" Or on the was to LJS I would say "Hay Bill there's a McDonald's!" He would just say "You know where were going."

Bill's last time at the Paradise and Pacific was in February. He was more tired than normal, but just as enthusiastic as always. At the end of the day though, he wanted to go home and forgo our normal run to LJS. Some time after that his daughter April texted me that Bill had gone to the hospital and then later on to a nursing home.

So after the June GCMR meeting Bill "THE GIMP" Richardson and I took a few train videos up and we watch them with Bill. In response to messages to all the clubs, Paradise and Pacific people Ron Smith Rick Fortmeyer and Bill Lazenby built a small portable "S" gauge layout on a 3 foot by 6 foot door did the detail work and took it over to Bill's Nursing home so that Bill again could run some trains. With that tight of curves, we needed small steam engines provided by Bill Richardson along with some tank cars and a caboose.

I would like to thank Ron Smith, Rick Fortmeyer, Mike Ragsdale, Dallas Dixon, Dana Price, Bill Richardson and Gary Bedford for all the help and being there so Bill could see train friends and run trains again. The layout was on display at the service for Bill, and will also be out at Railfair. I will really miss Bill. The drives to the club meetings will be much more lonely with out Bills smile, and where will I get anyone to pick on about The New York Central or worse the Penn Central?

MOUNTAINS ON THE HORIZON

I look at my layout and say," is there any project left to start?" Then I remember, in every video I've shot, when a train is passing the west wall of the basement, there is nothing there - other than windows and my railroad paintings.

A couple of years ago, I did plant telephone poles and strung wire. But in a way, that simply called more attention to the blank wall behind. Then, this spring, I came up with an idea. Why not take a panorama photo of the mountains



that surround our Big Chino Valley? I had experimented with panorama photos with my IPhone 8Plus camera and was extremely So, I had him print five sets of images onto a 4x8 sheet of foam core and the remaining part of the image on a 4x4 sheet



impressed. So, on a clear morning when the sun would be illuminating the mountains, I drove west on Big Chino Road to get a closer shot of the mountains. There is a tall range to the west, the Juniper mountains, that rise to well over 7000 feet and make a great panorama. But shooting them made me aware that I was not close enough to get a detailed image. So, before turning for home, I looked to the north and saw the Big Black Mesa, an earthquake fault uplift, running for about 20 miles directly north of me.

They are "always there" so I never thought of them as a subject. But from where I was, I got several locations for great panorama shots. Here it is. I then went to Photoshop Elements and resized it so that the top of the highest mountain image was 9" high. That was so, when the sky was trimmed out, the tallest image would not interfere with either the bottom of the windows or the picture frames.

When done, this image was 9 inches high by 11 feet long! And this wall is almost 50 feet long, I would need five prints to run the entire length.

I then went to Tom's Print Shop in Chino Valley to see if he could print five strips of my photo. Now Tom is a genius. Not only did he print our newsletter until we went totally digital, but he printed my layout control panel diagrams onto an aluminum material that makes them look very "professional"

So, asking Wendy at the print shop if they could print five of these which I would spray fix to foam core board, she said, we can not only do that, but Tom has a process where we can print images directly onto foam core. At home I took an Xactro knife and trimmed off the sky portions and then painted the edge of the foam core the same blue as the wall. It took a day to do each section, but after the five days, that entire side of the layout now has a backdrop of real mountains in the near distance. If you don't believe they are real, just look out the windows!



WITHER CAL STEWART

Over many years, the Cal Stewart meet in Pasadena was a "must attend" for many from both clubs, GCMR and the Desert Division. It was not only a great meet, but featured many operating layouts and an auction. And it was located in Pasadena which hosted great cultural sites, dining and shopping. Sadly, the meet had to be moved and over the last several years landing in three different locations and suffered declining attendance.. And finally, its host, the TTOS Southwestern Division, pulled the plug on the meet.

But all is not lost. The club hosts major monthly meets at the Arcadia Masonic Center in



Arcadia, which is just east of Pasadena. And their meets are really large. So if you want to try a trip to the coast to take in a Cal Stewart like meet, consider going to one of their meets. Later this year, there are meets on November 3 and December 1st. The December meet is special as they give out free passes at the commercial train meets for the four Open House Meets we host each year, every three months. The free pass stubs are put in a can for a drawing for a train car or accessory. Mike Marple from Lompoc brings ten tables of repair parts at these meets. This is one of a set of special meets which also usually have a larger number of sellers and buyers than for the other meets.
