PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

The proposed change to the by-laws regarding the policy book was given first approval by the members present at the August meeting. The change is designed to give the members more positive control over future changes. It will now be sent to all members in good standing for a vote and you should be receiving it in the next few weeks. The wording is printed elsewhere in this newsletter. Please return your ballot in time for it to be counted at the October 27th meeting. If you have any questions/concerns, please contact a BoD member.

The Beat the Heat bus trip was a success despite a few last minute cancels due to personal situations. The goal for next year is to fill up the bus.

The mobile layout has had some functional upgrades done to it that should reduce wear 'n tear. The upgrades give us better mobility but there is still an expense any time it's used. The discussion at the August meeting was whether to take the mobile layout on long trips, e.g., Cal-Stewart. The consensus seemed to be that there was no immediate problem in taking the trailer to Williams or Chandler for National Train Day (NTD) in May but out-ofstate venues may not be an option. One guiding factor was ROI - return on investment. In other words, venues such as Railfair, NTD, and other local events can generate not only public exposure but also new members. Thus, even though there's an expense, we could look at possibly getting a return whereas out-of-state events may not give us the return in which case we would need to somehow be compensated for the travel expense. We haven't

ruled out-of-state trips out but will need to look at them on a case by case basis. George Bean, Dave Brown, Bill East and Bill Richardson will take the layout to Cal-Stewart this November since we had told them we'd be there.

Elections will be coming up soon. The nominating committee is Dave Brown (480-650-5336 or eaglefour@juno.com) and Bill Lazenby (602-558-9222 or bicycle@msn.com). If you would be willing to serve, please let either of them know. Nominations must be received by the secretary (Rod or Wayne) by the October meeting with voting done in November.

Our public venues begin next month with Railfair on October 13th & 14th and continue every month through May. For us to present ourselves well means each member needs to find ways to help make the event a success. We will have sign-up sheets available at the meetings. As these various events occur, please look at your personal schedule, ask how you can help with the event, and volunteer accordingly. It is not up to a handful of members to do all the work nor is any one member expected to necessarily commit to an all-day presence.

The theme for the September meeting is "beverage cars". Simply bring in one or more of your favorite beverage cars (or trains) and let others know why it's a favorite. September will also be the pizza meet and drag races. Bring what you think will win the race. The winner will get six red raffle prize tickets.

Following is the proposed Policy Book change. (For online readers, the new language is in RED, for hard

copy readers, the proposed new language is in **BOLD**.)

ARTICLE IX. CLUB POLICY BOOK

SECTION A). Further interpretation and understanding of the Articles of Incorporation, By- laws, and Club policies can be found in the Club Policy Book (CPB).

SECTION B). Changes to the CPB may be proposed by any member in good standing. Such proposed change(s) shall be given to the Secretary who shall ensure that the proposed change(s) be given to the newsletter editor for publishing in the next issue of the club newsletter. The proposed change(s) shall be voted on at the next regularly scheduled, general membership meeting following that issue of the newsletter. An affirmative vote by a simple majority of the members present at that meeting shall be required to adopt the proposed change(s).

- + 2013 Budget will be reported to the membership. The raffle needs to be reevaluated.


BUILDING THE NEW MODULE, PART 2

Now that there is a theme for the new module, it is time to lay some track. The idea is to make two sidings off of the inside track facing the opposite direction of the siding on the grain elevator module. This makes for interesting switching problems.



Picture 1 show the track as laid out for the module. This is a rough layout as there lots to do first.



The first thing I mounted was the harness. I used four #4 by 5/8 wood screws to mount the harness on the underside of the module. Remember, the black and white wires are on the outside of the module. Next I soldered wires to the different tracks. I used 18 gauge wires for this. If you don't solder, Lionel makes terminal tracks, just make sure you know which wire is the outside track, and which one is the center rail. Next, I laid the track down to find where the wire holes should go. Using a ¼ inch bit, two holes were drilled.




Now comes the mounting of the track. The easiest way to do this is to start on the inside track first. Why, you ask? Well, this track is mounted along the back edge of the module, so it easy to figure out that placement. Again, I used #4 by 5/8 wood screws to screw down the track. One more thing about mounting the track. To make tracks the right length, which is 3/4" inch from the edge on both ends, small



filler pieces of track are used. These pieces of track have no screw holes, so put them in the middle of the run, not on the ends. On the ends, they have a tendency to come off when all the modules are taken apart.

Next comes the time to put down the outside track. Measure 18" from the center rail of the inside track to the center rail of the outside track. Using only one screw on the end that was just measured, do the same to the other end. Double check the first end, and if it is still right, finish mounting the rest of the outside track.



The last thing to do is to add the track wires into the harness under the layout. Now we're finished with the construction phase of the module. Next phase is the landscaping. That will be in part 3.




