#### Show and Tell

- Jack Eaton brought an O-gauge RMT Budd car that he also used as his temperature entry.
- Dallas Dixon brought an O-gauge Santa Fe passenger train.
- Bill Richardson brought an HO diesel powered freight train.
- Dave Brown held an LED wiring clinic.

The time at 11am was 88 thus Glenn was closest and won six monthly raffle tickets

#### Old Business

- Beat the Heat: Dave gave a bus trip and layout tour report. John will send a snail mail thank you to the four hosts on behalf of the GCMR. The bus cost more than previous years and the number of riders was less than the break even number. Dave will contact the bus companies to see what options there are for less expensive buses for next year. An increase in the per person cost may be needed.
- <u>Swap Meet</u>: John indicated the pre-meet activities will begin in about a month. We'll need to wait 'til October 1st to verify the date of the meet after which advertising can begin.
- <u>Permanent Location</u>: John reported that there is little new information on a permanent location. At Adobe Mountain, the fire hydrant issue is still unresolved along with what buildings fall under the restrictions, e.g., would a mobile home be considered a permanent structure. Barbara is still looking into the possibility of something being available in Mesa, possibly in Pioneer Park,

since many of our public venues are now on the east side.

- <u>Service Work</u>: George serviced the O gauge engines and noted the cheaper one was not repairable. Bill Richardson will service the S gauge engines. John will try to service the HO engines. Bob Dennison provided some needed couplers for the pre-war freight cars.
- Mini-Meet: The fall mini swap meet will be September 27th. Flyers have been distributed. PSAs and other media contacts will go out after Labor Day. A raffle prize needs to be identified. Tables are for members. If there are still tables available after a member gets one, a second table can then be obtained by a member. Members were encouraged to bring those trains and other items that they may not want but that the public might, e.g., HO & N gauge.

#### **New Business**

- -. Other Venues: Members were asked to think about what other venues the club might become involved with. John noted that Dave, Glenn and he are, at present, the only sources for towing the trailers thus other venues would involve their availability. Art Triant suggested the possibility of a Christmas themed layout that could be displayed. Such layouts would need to be designed and constructed so as to be transported in member vehicles.
- -. <u>Non-meeting Activities</u>: Members were asked to think about what other non-meeting activities they might want to have.






